



UPDATED: REQUIREMENTS TO ENTER ECUADOR AND THE GALAPAGOS!

Updated on September 13th, 2021



The Ecuadorian authorities decided to allow international travellers to freely travel in Ecuador and the Galapagos if they show the following documents upon arrival:

MAINLAND ECUADOR:

GALAPAGOS ISLANDS:

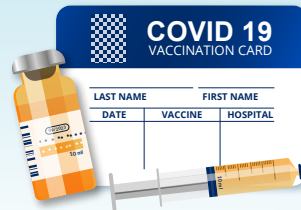
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- A negative COVID-19 PCR test taken no longer than 72 hours before arrival, or



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- A COVID-19 vaccination card showing they have had all of the necessary doses (the final dose must have been taken at least 14 days before travelling).



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- As of September 11th onwards: passengers with the ages of 2 or above visiting the Galapagos must have a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test result taken no longer than 72 hours prior to boarding their flights. **This means that being fully vaccinated for COVID-19 is not a valid method to enter the Galapagos Islands.**



IMPORTANTE

- Children under 2 years old are exempted from all of these requirements.
- Passengers from Brazil or India, or that had a stopover or layover in these countries will still need to show a negative PCR test taken no longer than 72 hours before arrival, even if they have been vaccinated. In addition to this, they must also spend 10 days of mandatory preventive isolation in any place of their choosing.
- Travel health insurance is mandatory for foreign tourists.
- The laissez-passer is no longer a requirement to enter the Galapagos.

BEFORE TRAVELING TO MAINLAND ECUADOR

All passengers will be asked to sign a Special Immigration Form agreeing to obey the protocols established by the authorities as well as a Traveler Health Form that needs to be signed before disembarking the flight.
